## A GLOSSARY OF POETIC TERMS

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ALLITERATION	The repetition of the same consonant at the beginning
	of/or within a word or words
ALLUSION	A reference to something outside the poem itself, but
	which is used to further the meaning of the poem
ANALOGY	The comparison of one thing with another
ASSONANCE	The repetition of the same vowel at the beginning of/or
	within a word or words
BALLAD	A poem which tells a story in four line stanzas, usually
	with a regular beat
IMAGERY	Verbal comparisons used to move beyond the literal
	meaning to create a picture
METAPHOR	A form of comparison in which one thing is completely
	identified with another
ΟΝΟΜΑΤΟΡΟΕΙΑ	The sound of the word echoes the meaning of the sound
	described
PERSONIFICATION	A comparison in which inanimate objects are given
	personal qualities
RHYME	The repetition of the same sound within or at the end of
	lines, usually in a pattern
RHYTHM	The metrical pattern of the poem and its lines
SIMILE	The simplest comparison in which one thing is
	compared to another 'like' or 'as'
SONNET	A poem, usually of fourteen lines, usually of five beats
	each, which explores a feeling or state of mind
STANZA	The grouping of lines together into patterns
TONE	The attitude or feeling of the writer towards the subject
	matter of the poem
